#### Alastair Fraser: Hadrian's Wall: a journey through time, places and imagination

The talk covers the logistics of walking the Wall and examines the different remains to be seen and how they relate to the construction and history of the Wall.

#### Dr John Banham: The Backhouses of Darlington – Quaker Bankers

John Banham, who is the Secretary of Durham County Local History Society, will talk about Backhouses' Bank of Darlington 1774-1836. The bank's Quaker partners were important figures in financing the Stockton & Darlington Railway. Dr Banham will explain how the bank was developed from an eighteenth century Darlington linen business expanding in the early nineteenth century to have branches throughout the North East. Backhouses' Bank merged with Barclays in 1896.

#### Dr Richard Pears: David Stephenson (1757-1819) architect and town planner

Stephenson designed All Saints Church in Newcastle, a superb Georgian building. He also designed Mosley and Dean Streets in Newcastle, and worked as the Duke of Northumberland's architect at North Shields, Alnwick and Prudhoe Castles. He was one of the founders of the Newcastle Literary and Philosophical Society and built a country house for himself at Waldridge Hall, near Chester-le-Street.

# Niall Hammond: The Stockton & Darlington Railway; the railway that got the world on track 1825-2025.

The opening of the S&DR in 1825 ushered in a transport and social revolution which changed the world. The talk will discuss how and why the S&DR was built, it's influence and plans for the bicentenary in 2025.
